Pursuant to the legislation the Board can request an extension to the timeline before or after the due date.

Stay – On December 7, 2020 a Consent Order was filed in the Court of Queen’s Bench (Action No. 2001-05670) stating that Badlands undertakes not to conduct any physical alteration of the wetlands subject to the Approval until the Minister makes a decision (following the hearing) on the appeals.
